## Rising Senior Summer [11th-12th Grade]:

This summer is all about getting ready for college applications season that comes around in the twelfth grade.

If you have time, consider participating in competitive summer programs, internships, or research opportunities to enhance your resume.

It's also advisable to use some of your time this summer to begin working on your college essays and gathering all the materials you'll need for your applications. Remember, everything you can do now to help you stay ahead will pay dividends when your schedule picks up during the semester.

### Senior Year [12th Grade]:

## FALL Note application deadlines and set calendar reminders for each of your final colleges. Virtually visit colleges on your list. Outline your financial aid plan. Apply for traditional scholarships. Take the SAT/ACT one last time, if needed to boost your candidacy. Put the finishing touches on your college application essays and supplemental materials. Formally ask for letters of recommendation if you were unable to at the end of junior year (and/or remind your recommenders about upcoming dates). Submit early decision and action applications. Submit CSS Profile if applying early (and if required by colleges). Ensure official SAT/ACT score reports are sent to early application schools. Go into any early admissions interviews confidently!
